The Rector's Message

Dear Friends and Companions in Ministry,

During the season of Epiphany, we are encouraged to look outside ourselves and notice the movement of God in our lives and in our world. When, and in what ways, do you see God at work in your daily life and circumstances? When have you had a moment of knowing something of the divine life in what could look to others as “normal?” Looking to the Bible, we have learned much about Jesus as epiphany moments experienced long ago signaled to those with eyes to see and hears to hear that the Savoir was among them. We continue to celebrate the season of Epiphany through February 16th.

On February 17th, Lent begins with Ash Wednesday. The season of Lent, in certain ways, encourages us to look inside ourselves, to be introspective in a good sense, and consider who we are for God and how we are living out our calling to be God's beloved. Lent is a penitential season because as we consider God's call to us and who we are for God, we also know how we are not perfect in our love for God. In our culture that is quick to blame others for personal shortcomings, Lent gives us a focused time to say, as in the words of the personal confession (*Book of Common Prayer* p. 447.), “I have sinned by my own fault...” Be it in personal confession to a priest or in prayer with God, being specific and tak-

ing responsibility enables us to know God's forgiveness and the depth of God's love for us in real, personal ways, and not just in the abstract.

Lent is intended to be a time of preparation for Easter. How do you want to prepare for Easter this year? We have the traditional disciplines of the church, which do convey grace and make us more open to God: coming to church; receiving communion; confessing our sins; giving something up for Lent, to name a few. Are there creative ways that you can prepare for Easter? Perhaps there are spiritual practices that only you and God know would be best for you? Taking on something for Lent can be a creative way of getting more in tune with God. What would that be for you? Rather than being a gloomy time, Lent is meant to be a time of growth and a time to know more fully how loved you are by God. May Lent be a holy time for you.

Treasurer's Report 2009

In 2009 our pledges totaled \$128,000.00. Of those pledges, we received \$125,519.00. With the income we received from other sources such as the yard sale, non-pledged giving and others, our total general fund income was \$168,120.00. We budgeted for expenses of \$160,345.00, but our actual expenses were \$170,860.00.

Our Building and Maintenance fund, which is used for non-routine repairs, had a balance at the beginning of 2009 of \$14,650.00 and we were given a gift of \$1,000.00 for this fund. The repairs and maintenance on the building cost us \$8,656.00. This leaves a balance in the building and maintenance fund of \$6,994.00.

The Kremer fund balance began at \$16,868.00. \$1,000.00 was transferred to the general fund early in the year, leaving a balance of \$15,868.00.

Our Memorial fund balance is \$4119.74. No money was spent this year from this fund.

For 2010 we have 56 adult pledges of approximately \$102,000.00, and 8 youth pledges of \$475.00. We expect to receive \$120,645.00 this year in total income.

Our expenses this year are expected to be \$163,206.00. This leaves a significant shortfall of over \$40,000.00. As most of you know, we receive no assistance from the diocese. We are self-supporting, so it's never too late to make or increase your pledge. A monthly treasurer's report is hung on the bulletin board in the hallway, and if you have any questions, please contact me.

Printer/Copier Cartridges

St Paul's on-the-Hill uses STAPLES for supplies. Trudi recently learned that the company gives a \$3.00 credit for old, used, or new & unused (obsolete printers/copiers) ink cartridges. Here's the deal – STAPLES, for signing up in their “Rewards Program”, offers \$3.00 credit for each cartridge returned to the store – up to 10 per month. Using simple math, that multiplies up to \$30 per month and goes up to \$360 a year!

A marked box will be available in the office for used ink cartridges. SPOTH has earned \$24 this month for the eight already recycled. We can recycle more than 10 per month but we only get the credit for the first 10. HELP US OUT!



Rector's Report

Annual Parish Meeting
St. Paul's on-the-Hill
January 17, 2010

Catherine's sermon gives us a great way to think about our ministry: God at the center, for the common good, and ministry that respects the dignity of every human being. Being the church, being the body of Christ in the world is a special call from God. We are called to share the light of Christ with all, as God calls us to do.

In 2009, we continued to share God's light with each other and with the wider community. We were recognized for our outreach to the hungry by Millbrook High School, being named their community beneficiary for a food collection at recent sporting events. When I asked the Millbrook Sports Association representative how it was that St. Paul's on-the-Hill had been chosen, she replied that our church is known in the community for helping people, that our food pantry is known, and that the Sports Association wanted to support an organization that reaches out to their local community. We are making a difference to our community, and people are aware of our efforts. God is at the center of our outreach ministry, it is for the common good, and the ministry respects the dignity of every human being. We have also heard about our Prayer Shawl Ministry. Those shawls carry with them the love and compassion we have for those who are ill.

Jesus healed those in need, and we as the body of Christ continue that ministry in many ways. In addition to our food pantry and our prayer shawl ministry, we hold a service every Wednesday night at 7pm that is a healing service. That is one explicit way we seek to be companions with God in healing, but there are also other ways of healing. Being the welcoming church that we are makes us a force for healing in a world divided in so many ways. We are a place of peace in a chaotic world. We are a place of strength for all who come with problems or sadness or fears... and everyone has those things from time to time.

We help heal the brokenness of life by being a place of community. In 2009, we welcomed over 40 new members to our church. We now have over seventy children in the church. Our church is not a slave to tradition, the sort of tradition as when people say, "We've always done it this way." Our community changes as new people join us and offer the gifts that God has given them for our common good. The gifts that children bring are numerous; they give us hope and joy and they challenge us to be the best mentors that we can be. In response to the growing number of children, we have added a new Sunday school class for 3, 4, and 5 year olds, called Godly Play. Godly Play had been used here previously, but had not been used 5 years or so. In 2009, we also added a new youth group, the Middle School Youth Group.

Our offering for Adult Christian Formation in 2009 continued to include our Adult Sunday School at 9am, our Book Club, the Rector's Read, the Wednesday Bible Study, our Lenten Program. Added to Adult Formation in 2009 was the Tuesday noon Bible Study and I offered Group Spiritual Direction. The two Spiritual Direction groups of six persons each met for a number of months. There are plans to offer Group Spiritual Direction again in 2010. One of the things I love about being a parish priest, and one of the things that drew me to this ministry, is the chance to work with people of all ages. I might be at a youth group meeting one hour and the next hour at the bedside of an elderly member. Of course, an important part of my ministry as your priest is to help you identify your gifts for ministry and support you in exercising your gifts. The more we grow, the more it is obvious that I can't begin to do everything on my own even if I wanted to do so. For example, expanding our pastoral care to include more visits by our Lay Eucharistic Ministers, the ones who take communion to the home-bound and sick, enabled us to have over 50 home communion visits in 2009. My ministry is really to help you find your ministry

One of the God-centered developments of 2009, was God's call to us to be a place of welcome and support to those in the ordination process. It is wonderful to

have Catherine Hicks with us today; she is in a sense the embodiment of our ministry with seminarians. Catherine was with us for eight weeks last summer. Melanie Lewis, who attends Eastern Mennonite seminary, was with us for the spring semester of 2009; Melanie designed and taught our 2009 Lenten program. I love being a mentor, and working with Melanie and Catherine was a joy for me. Having seminarians also required that a number of you took on the role of mentor, all of you had a role in their formation, and a few served on their lay committees. Having the honor of working with seminarians was a gift to us.

One of the contributions that Catherine made was to organize a summer program for families with young children. Those three nights of prayer and playing, fun and fellowship, gave us a foundation and a model for continuing to have events for families with young children. In November and December, Young Family Nights were held. These gatherings are for families with children ten years old and younger, though families with older children are welcome if they would like to attend. Older siblings often attend and help with the children's activity. The next Young Family Night will be held on February 12th.
